description / background

-Informal businesses require boundaries to mark their territory to establish themselves and gain economic and social stability


1. Temporary street Vendors mark their territory on the pavement
2. Semi-permanent street vendors mark shop boundaries using concrete cobbles, cane cages, and umbrellas
- 3 and 5. Toc Toc and microbusses parking marked using traffic cones and vehicles themselves
4. Kiosks mark their boundaries using their own merchandise
5. Macro: usage of gateways (train crossing and mazla'an), vertical transportation (underneath bridges and stairs), nodes, and intersections that act as a hub that hosts informal business; this hub itself on a macro scale marks a boundary




